

EUROPEAN BOTTLED BEERS

Ayinger Celebrator Doppelbock (Germany)

Originally brewed at a monastery in northern Italy, "double bock" was quickly introduced by Bavarian brewers to compete with bock. Doppelbock name ends with the suffix "-ator."

Profoundly dark, rich elixir with a complex fruitiness of roasted malt and whole hop flowers. Semi-dry finish.

Duvel Golden Ale (Belgium)

Strong golden ale, fruity and lush with a strong noble hop aroma, a full body, and a delicate, well rounded, and unusually smooth finish.

Lindeman's Framboise (Belgium)

Long before hops were common in most beers, various fruits and vegetables were used to season beers. The acidity of Lambic beers blends perfectly with raspberries. Rose in color and has a magnificent aroma, delicate palate of raspberries with undertones of fruity acidity. Sparkling clean natural taste.

Schneider Weisse (Germany)

The Original German Weisse Beer. Amber-mahogany color with fruit, clove, and nutmeg apple aromas. Clean, full-bodied, and well balanced, light, bitter finish.

Radeburger Pilsner (Germany)

The quality of this pale lager was so outstanding that the Royal Court of Saxony and Prince Otto von Bismarck appointed the brewery as purveyor to their courts. This pilsner has a clear, pale golden color with fine, creamy foam, predominant hops taste with pleasant, subtle distinct note of hops bitterness.

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Orval (Belgium)

Brewed and bottle-conditioned at Orval monastery founded during the 1100's in the pastoral Belgium countryside.

Fermenting three times with three different malts and two types of hops gives great character and complexity to this beer.

Stella Artois (Belgium)

Stella, the Latin word for star, was first introduced in celebration of the festive season. It was an instant sensation, and became so popular that it stayed in demand throughout history and for decades to come.

Weihenstephaner Original Lager (Germany)

Widely believed to be the oldest brewery, Weihenstephaner, is located 15 miles north of Munich. Mild methods of fermentation and a long lagering period in the brewery's natural cellars allow a wholesome beer to mature.

Augustine Brau (Germany)

Described as Augustiner Munich Light in the American market. Light refers to its color, not its body.

Bitburger Premium Pilsner (Germany)

Drawing on almost 200 years of expertise, this full-bodied, light, and of course, premium beer, is brewed according to the German Purity Law. It's popular dry-finished, hoppy taste, has secured Bitburger Premium Beer the position of Germany's number one draught beer.
